What do we find on a superficial reading of Scripture?



- M/F created equal in God's image; in worth & responsibility
- Genesis 2 hierarchical relationship between man/woman
- Fall mars M/F relationship but God plans to reconcile ALL
- Patriarchal cultures in OT/NT, in Israel and beyond
- NT statements of liberty, equality and borderless freedom across lines of race, gender, social class

Defining the two views...

- Complementarianism stresses that although men and women are equal in personhood, they are created for different roles.
- Egalitarianism also agrees that men and women are equal in personhood but holds that there are no gender-based limitations on the roles of men and women.

Complementarian beliefs...

Though not all who call themselves complementarian will adhere to the same views, they are usually characterized by:

- Belief that only men should hold church leadership positions over other men. Usually, women may hold positions that do not place them in authority over men.
- A patriarchal view of the family, with the father as the head.
- The view that a man should love his wife as <u>Christ</u> loved the church, and a woman should submit to her husband as the church submits to Christ.





Though not all who call themselves egalitarian will adhere to the same views, they are usually characterized by:

- Men and women can both hold any church leadership positions.
- Spouses are equally responsible for the family.
- Marriage is a partnership of two equals submitting to one another.
- Roles should be ability-based and not gender-based.

The Prayer of Indifference/Relinquishment...



The *prayer of indifference* expresses the fact that we have come to a place where we want God's will—nothing more, nothing less, nothing else.

... It is a **prayer** in which we abandon ourselves to God.

The Prayer of Indifference/Relinquishment...



"In the context of spiritual discernment, indifference is a positive term signifying that I am indifferent to anything but God's will. This is interior freedom or a state of openness to God in which we are free from undue attachment to any particular outcome.... We ask God to bring us to a place where we want God's will, nothing more, nothing less, nothing else."
